## EXECUTIVE BOARD MINUTES JANUARY 31, 2013 DVC ROOM, L-151

The meeting was called to order at 2:29 P.M.

- 2. ANNOUNCEMENTS-
- Newly elected UF President, Glenn Appell stated that he would like to move toward paper reduction at UF Executive Board meetings and use the video projector instead.
- Appell reported on the CA Governor's budget highlights that CA State Chancellor, Brice W.
  Harris had put together in a webinar, and stated that community college funding will grow
  significantly due to the recently pass Proposition 39 ballot initiative.
- Appell reported there are 9 Executive Board members attending next month's FACCC conference and the March in March event at the Capitol on Monday March 4. He will include students to accompany members for legislative visits.
- Michels won the John McFarland literary achievement award from FACCC this year for his outstanding service. Named for former FACCC President John McFarland, this award is given annually to an outstanding full- or part-time faculty member who contributes to the education of faculty and promotes faculty issues through FACCC publications.
- Keating reported on last week's Bay Faculty Association meeting and stated that San Francisco
  college is having accreditation issues. The Santa Rosa salary comparison study has been
  published and is available to view at <a href="www.santarosa.edu">www.santarosa.edu</a>. Appell invited members to the monthly
  BFA meetings at Francesco's restaurant in Oakland.
- Appell reported that Yosemite and Modesto Community College Districts are having ongoing
  issues with F-T faculty lay-offs and budget problems. Michels stated that he and Rich Hansen
  will be going to the campuses to present ideas and hold discussions regarding raising dues or
  affiliation options.
- Appell presented tokens to the Executive Board V.P.'s. He went on to say that he will be holding leadership training meetings and delegating more responsibilities. Meeting dates and times will be discussed at the next Executive Board meeting.
- Dahl-Shanks is coordinating the third annual UF Benefits and Retirement conference to be held this year at Diablo Valley College on Friday April 12 from 9:00am to 3:30pm in the Diablo

Room (cafeteria). The focus of the conference is on healthcare and there will be representatives from Cal-PERS, Cal-STRS, Social Security Administration, Pension 2, and many others.

- The California Part-time Faculty Association (CPFA) is holding its annual conference at Diablo Valley College on Saturday April 20 from 9:30am to 4:00pm in the Trophy room. All faculty are welcome. The opening speaker will be FACCC Executive Director Jonathan Lightman and the keynote speaker will be Sharon Hendrickson, our community-college representative on the CalSTRS Advisory Board. There will be a social dinner after the event. More specifics on registering for the conferences will come soon (and will be posted on the UF website: www.uf4cd.org).
- VP reports: CCC's VP Michels announced evaluation trainings and a part time orientation workshop will be scheduled within the next few weeks. He went to say the Box 2A process was very successful and they hired 6 full-time faculty.

The UF's Part-Time Faculty Advocate, Dildine stated that P-T faculty should be more involved in negotiations and that he will hold meetings on each campus in the next few months to get Part-time faculty members to join the United Faculty so that they can vote in elections.

DVC's VP, Wapner reported that she and Appell attended the recent Part-time orientation meeting. They held a Full-time faculty evaluation training seminar on January 30, 2013 and there is another one scheduled at DVC on February 7, 2013 at 4:00 pm in L-151. At the Box 2A meeting, Appell reported that 8 new Full-time faculty will be hired at DVC.

LMC's VP, Zilber reported that he will be holding a Full-time evaluation training workshop on February 12, at 12:30pm. At the recent Box 2A meeting it was announced that LMC will hire 3 new F-T faculty, one of whom is replacing the Nursing Director. He went on to say that Part-time UF representative Luis Morales will no longer be serving as the Part-time representative from LMC, as he is going from a part-time faculty member to a tenure track faculty member.

• Appell reported that the United Faculty office expansion is in the works. A few details have to be agreed to and construction is expected to begin summer of 2013.
